
Notes on the chord change from G7 to F7 in the Chorus

First the numbering of strings.

Note the 1st string is tuned to the highest note A and when you are playing is physically at the bottom of the Uke's neck.

String number → 4321
GCEA ←Tuned to

F7, C and G7 fingering (where 1 = first or index finger etc):



The change from G7 to F7:

Move 2nd finger from 2nd fret of 3rd string to 2nd fret of 4th string, which makes F chord

Move 3^{rd} finger from 2^{nd} fret of 1^{st} string to 3^{rd} of fret 3^{rd} string & place 4^{th} finger on 3^{rd} fret of 1st string, which makes F7 chord
